



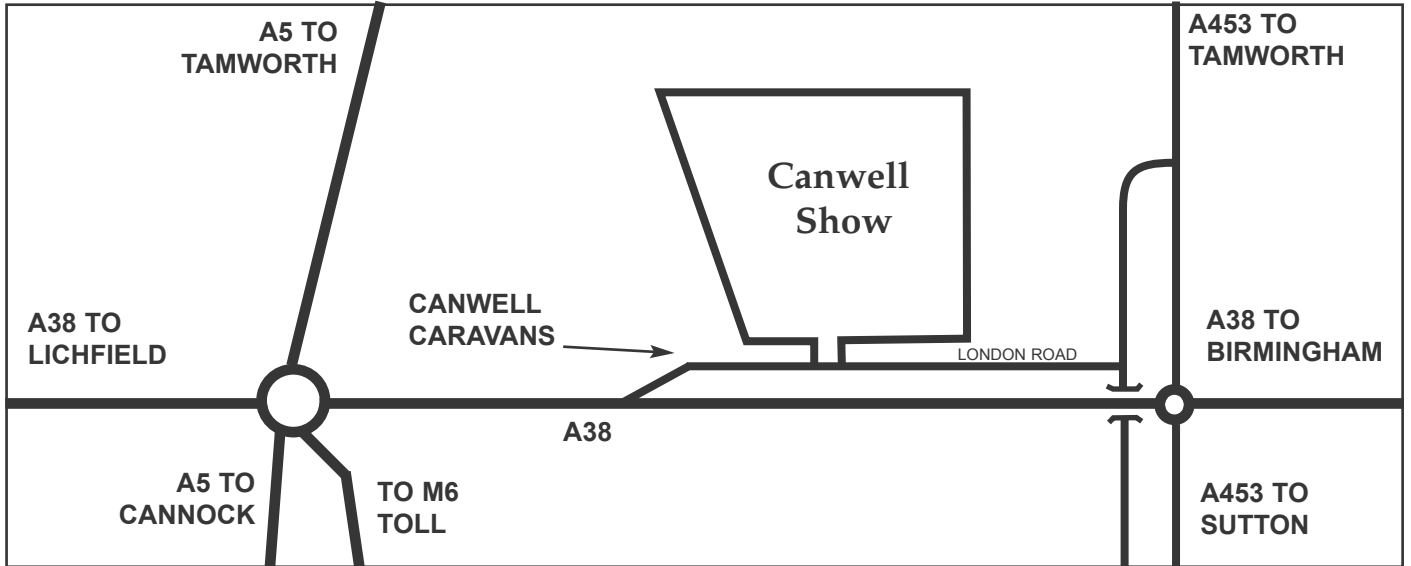

CANWELL ESTATE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY - SHOW RULES

1. **MEMBERSHIP** Membership of the Society shall be open to persons residing on Canwell Estate and to other persons nominated and approved by the Committee. Members shall be allotted one badge (non-transferable) for admission to the Show and Member's Enclosure.
 2. **ENTRIES**
 - 2.a. Schedules, with entry forms, are obtainable from the Secretary.
 - 2.b. Entries to be made on the form provided, which should be signed by the Exhibitor, and forwarded to the Secretary by the closing date, together with the entry fee as set out in the Schedule. No return of entry fee will be made unless a written application is received by the Secretary prior to the Show, accompanied by a current Veterinary Surgeon's Certificate (where appropriate).
 - 2.c. The total minimum entry fee is £5.00 per person (Children's Classes excepted).
 - 2.d. The Secretary will acknowledge receipt of entries at least six days prior to the Show in the Marquee Section, other Sections nine days. In case of non-receipt of an acknowledgement, Exhibitors must at once inform the Secretary to this effect.
 - 2.e. The Society reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate any class should there not be sufficient entries.
 3. **EXHIBITS**
 - 3.a. All entries are made at the risk of the Exhibitor, the Society accepting no responsibility for loss or damage through any cause whatsoever.
 - 3.b. No distinguishing marks other than numbers, labels, cards etc, allocated by the Society will be permitted on any exhibit until after judging.
 - 3.c. All exhibits and stock generally must be on the Showground and placed in their respective positions by Exhibitors at least 30 minutes before the time given for judging.
 - 3.d. No exhibits in the Livestock Classes may leave the Show before 4.00 p.m.; other exhibits 5.15 p.m.
 - 3.e. Cattle and Horses must at all times be adequately secured.
 - 3.f. Prize winning Livestock must be present for all awards and parade round the Main Ring at such times as the Committee may order. The Committee reserves the right to withhold prize money if prizewinners do not parade.
 4. **EXHIBITORS**
 - 4.a. An Exhibitor shall be allowed one Exhibitor's admittance card.
 - 4.b. Exhibitors must obey Officials regarding Health & Safety at all times.
 - 4.c. Any Exhibitor showing an exhibit in any class belonging to another party and entering the same as his or her own, exercising any artifice to deceive the Judges, or otherwise attempting to obtain a prize by unfair means, shall forfeit all claims to any prize which may have been awarded.
 - 4.d. Exhibitors in the Marquee classes must provide their own dishes and stands for exhibits, for which articles the Society will not accept responsibility for loss or damage.
 - 4.e. Winners of Cups and Trophies to return same to the Secretary in good order by the following 24th June, or as directed by the Committee. Failure to comply with this Rule, a charge of £10.00 will be made, plus any expenses incurred to obtain the return of the Cups or Trophies.
 - 4.f. Prize money will be forwarded within 28 days of the Show.
 5. **JUDGING**
 - 5.a. Prizes in any class may be withheld by the Judge if exhibits are not up to merit, and no third prize awarded if less than four exhibits in any class, unless specially recommended by the Judge.
 - 5.b. A Judge shall have power to disqualify any exhibits found to be fraudulently dealt with or not in accordance with the classification set out in the Schedule. The decision of the Judge will, in all cases, be Final.
 - 5.c. Only exhibitors and authorised Officials will be allowed in the Rings, and authorised Officials in the Marquees, when judging is in progress.
 6. **HEALTH AND SAFETY** This is an agricultural and equine show with livestock attending and participating both in arena and showground events. Livestock can be unpredictable and can be startled by crowds or unusual noises. The Society does consider the health and safety of people and livestock to be of paramount importance and will continue to take every precaution reasonably practical to prevent any accident, injury or illness. Please note however, that the Society will not accept any responsibility for any accident or illness howsoever caused and asks everyone attending to take every precaution to prevent such occurrences.
- THE BRITISH SHOW JUMPING ASSOCIATION ("BSJA") - RULE 82.21**
No member of BSJA shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete, in any show jumping competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.
7. **HATS.** Anyone riding a horse or pony must wear a hard hat of a standard approved by the Governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting and be properly fastened. In any event all equestrian competitors must wear a hard hat in accordance with British Safety Standard specifications securely fastened whilst mounted.
 8. **OBJECTIONS** Any objections and protests to be in writing and lodged with the Secretary during the day of the Show. The objector must at the same time lodge a sum of £10.00 in the hands of the Treasurer, which deposit shall be forfeited if the Committee considers the objection frivolous or without merit and in this respect the Committee's decision shall be final. The Committee, whose decision shall be final, shall decide anything not provided for in the foregoing Show Rules.

Recipe: 100g (3½oz) smoked back bacon rashers, 275g (9½oz) plain flour, 1 tablespoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon caster sugar, 1 teaspoon salt, 125g (4½oz) grated Edam cheese, 75g (2¾oz) sun-dried tomatoes (roughly chopped), 2 tablespoon snipped fresh chives, 2 eggs, 200ml (7 fl oz) milk, 75g (2¾oz) melted butter.

Method: Preheat oven to 190°C/375°F/ Gas 5. Line a twelve cup muffin tin with 10 paper cases. Grill the bacon until crispy and chop into pieces. In a large bowl, sift together the flour & baking powder. Stir the sugar, salt, three-quarters of the cheese, bacon, tomatoes and chives into the flour mixture and mix well. In another bowl, beat together the eggs, milk and melted butter, and pour over the dry ingredients. Stir until just combined. The batter will be lumpy. Fill the muffin cases as evenly as possible and sprinkle the tops with the remaining Edam. Bake for 20-25 mins until risen and firm.

tin. Smooth the top and bake on a baking tray for 1 hour. Make up the marmalade syrup by whisking all the ingredients together. Set aside to dissolve. As soon as the cake comes out of the oven, prick all over the top with a skewer and spoon over the marmalade syrup. Leave to cool in the tin before turning out.

Class 163. Victoria Jam Sandwich

Recipe: 2 large hens eggs, their weight (with shells) in margarine, caster sugar & SR flour, pinch of salt, 3-4 drops of vanilla essence.

Method: Sieve flour & salt, beat margarine until soft. Add sugar & essence, cream together until mixture is light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time together with a tablespoon of flour, beat well after each addition, stir in remainder of flour & salt. Place mixture into 2 lined 7in sandwich tins. Smooth level with a knife. Bake in moderately hot oven 190°C/375°F/ Gas 5 for 20 - 35 mins or until cooked. When cold sandwich together with raspberry jam.

Class 164. Muffins (Yeast recipe)

Recipe: 225ml (8 fl oz) milk, 55ml (2 fl oz) water, 1 teaspoon caster sugar, 2 level teaspoon dried yeast, a little lard, 450g (1lb) strong plain flour, 1 rounded teaspoon salt, a little rice flour or plain flour for dusting.

Method: Heat milk & water in a small saucepan until just hand hot. Pour into a jug, add the sugar and dried yeast, mix it with a fork and leave about 10 minutes to get a real frothy head. Sift flour & salt into a large mixing bowl, make a well in the centre, pour in yeast mixture and mix to a soft dough. Knead dough for about 10 min, by which time it should be smooth and elastic. Return to bowl, loosely cover with an oiled polythene bag, and leave in a warm place for about 45 mins until the dough has doubled in size. On a lightly floured surface roll out the dough to about 1cm (½ in) thick, then using a 7.5cm (3 in) plain cutter cut out about 12 rounds. Place muffins on an ungreased, lightly floured baking sheet, sprinkling with a little more flour, then cover with a loosely tied plastic bag and leave to puff up for about 25-35 mins in a warm place. When they are ready to be cooked, grease a thick-based frying pan or griddle with just a trace of lard. Then heat the pan over a medium heat, add some muffins and them cook for about 7 mins on each side, turning the heat down to low as soon as they go in. Repeat until all are cooked. Display 3 on a plate.

Class 165. Farmhouse Fruit Cake

Recipe: 227g (8oz) SR flour, 113g (4oz) margarine, 113g (4oz) Demerara sugar, 398g (14oz) luxury mixed dried fruit, 2 large eggs, 1 tablespoon milk(approx), ¼-½ teaspoon mixed spice, pinch of salt.

Method: Grease and line a 6in round cake tin. Set the oven at 160°C/320°F/Gas 4-5. Rub in the butter until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Then mix in all remaining dry ingredients. Mix to a fairly stiff "dropping" consistency, with eggs and milk. Turn the mixture into the tin and smooth the top. Bake in the oven for 1½ hours approx until a skewer comes out clean. Turn out and cool on a wire rack.

Class 166. Banana & Honey Teabread

Recipe: 113g (4oz) margarine, 113g (4oz) soft light brown sugar, 113g (4oz) set honey, 2 beaten eggs, 227g (8oz) SR flour, ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg or cinnamon, 2 large bananas, squeeze of lemon juice.

Method: Pre-heat oven to 180° C/ 350° F/ Gas 4. Lightly grease and line a 2lb loaf tin. Beat together margarine, sugar and honey in a bowl until light and fluffy. Gradually beat in eggs, then fold in flour and nutmeg or cinnamon. Peel bananas, mash flesh with a little lemon juice. Fold mashed bananas into Teabread mixture until well mixed. Spoon the mixture into prepared tin and level surface. Bake for 1 -1¼ hours or until risen, golden

Method: Rub butter into other ingredients until mixture resembles fine crumbs. Work together into a dough. Roll small balls about 2.5cm/1in in diameter. Put them 5cm/2in apart on a greased baking tray. Flatten with a fork dipped in cold water. Bake above middle of moderate oven, 180°C/350°F/ Gas 4, for 10 - 12minutes until pale gold in colour. Remove from baking tray onto wire rack. Sprinkle with caster sugar while still hot. Display 5 on a plate.

Class 161. Weetabix Tea Bread, to be made by a child 9 to 12 yrs of age.

Recipe: 200g (8oz) SR flour, sieved, 3 weetabix, 250ml (0.5pint) milk, 225g (9oz) sugar, 150g (6oz) sultanas, 1 beaten egg.

Method. Pre-heat oven to 180° C/ fan 160° C/350°F/Gas 4. Grease & line a 7cm-deep, 20cm diam round springform tin. Whisk together the butter, caster sugar, eggs, SR flour, baking powder & ground almonds until combined. Spoon the mixture into the prepared
